◆ Pause Before You Post

A gentle reminder for mindful sharing in the digital age

Before you share a moment that includes your child, ask yourself these five questions. Each one is designed to protect their future, honor their boundaries, and strengthen your relationship offline.

- 1. Would I want this posted about me at this age?
 - If the roles were reversed, would this image or moment feel respectful ~ or embarrassing?
- 2. Is this moment sacred, silly ~ or shaming?
 - Not every private scene needs to be public. Some memories are better cherished in silence.
- 3. Could this be screenshot and misunderstood later?
 - Once shared, posts live beyond your intent. Could this be taken out of context?
- 4. Did my child give real consent, or am I assuming it?
 - Consent isn't a smile. It's a conversation. Check in ~ even with the young ones.
- 5. Will this strengthen their identity ~ or expose their vulnerability?

 Ask yourself: Am I sharing to celebrate, or to entertain others at their expense?
